Patrol Activity Comparisons



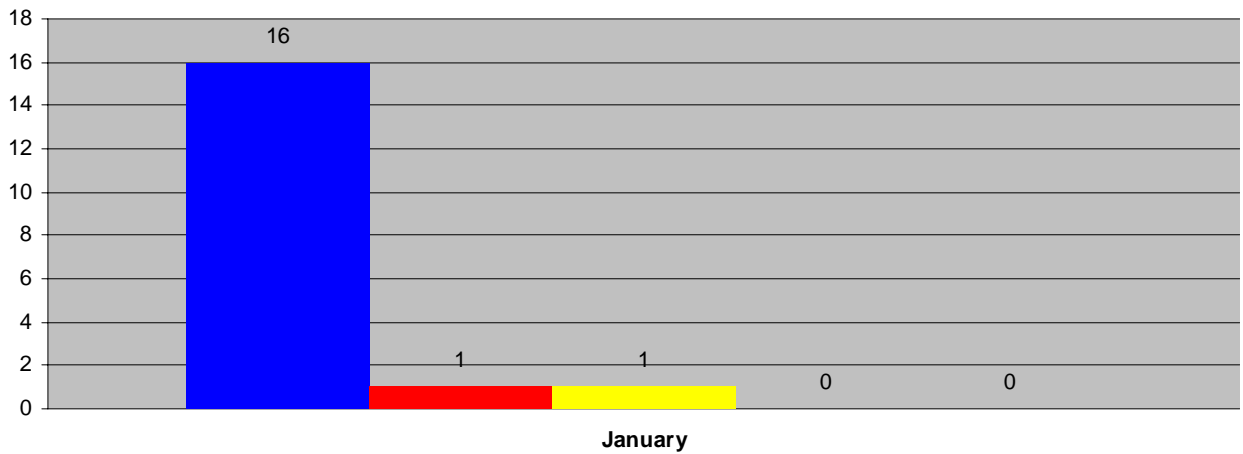

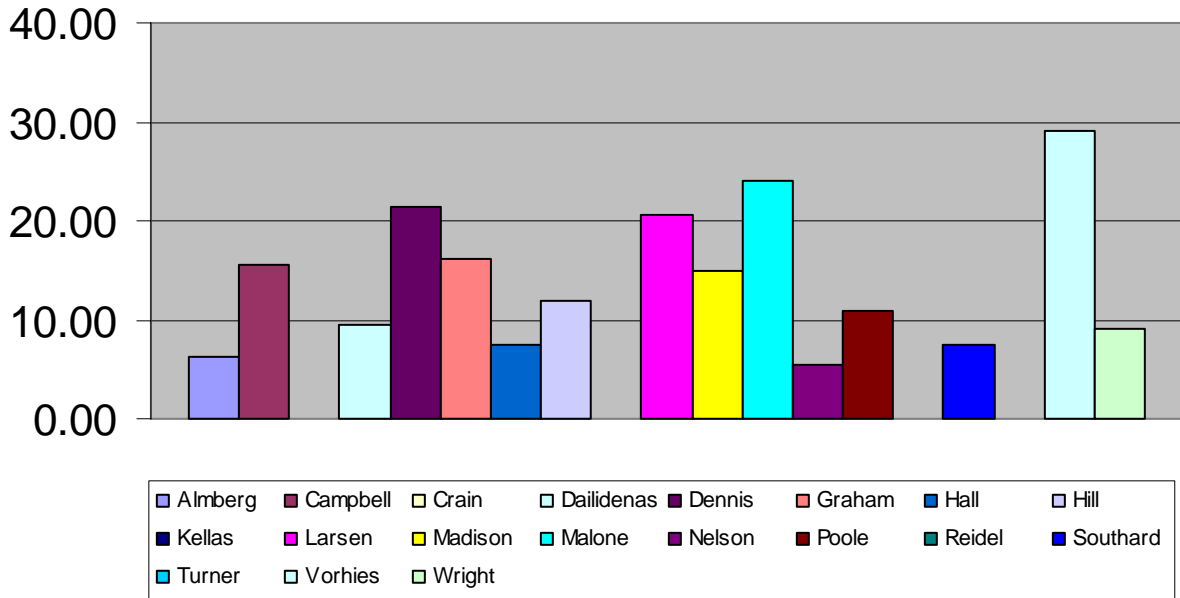

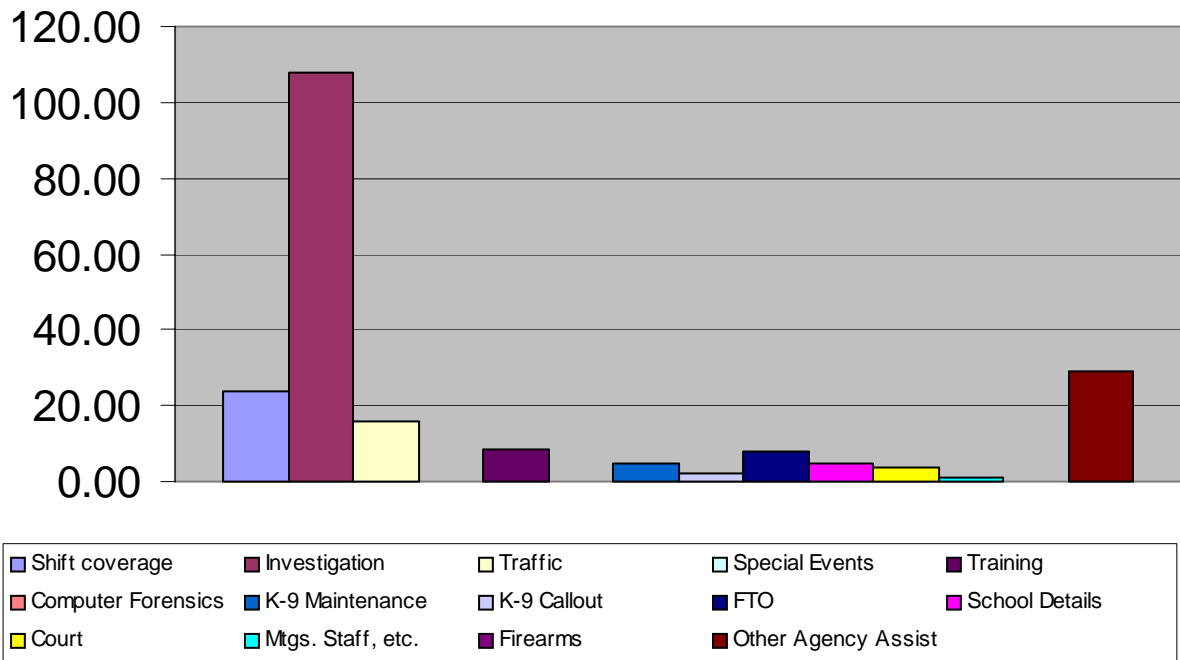




Overtime by Officer

'Personal Attention to Our Community'

The **Uniform Crime Report (UCR)** is administered by the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) and is part of the national UCR Program managed by the FBI. Sequim Police statistics are compiled monthly and become part of the state and national reporting process that tracks specific crimes, but not all crimes and criminal occurrences that are reported to the police. **Part 1 crimes** are defined as a set of 8 felony crimes that can be compared on a statewide and national basis. **Part 2 crimes** are a set of 9 specific lesser violent crimes that can also be compared from jurisdiction to jurisdiction.
